40 Hours for Our Lord Fri. March 8th–Sun. March 10th


Next weekend, March 8th - 10th, Saint Ignatius Catholic Church and The Church of Saint Timothy are coming together in a

CATHOLIC SCHOOLS STUDY

All Catholic schools in the Archdiocese of St. Paul and Minneapolis are

undergoing a new required accreditation process focused specifically on best practices and our Catholic faith. This Catholic School Study includes a "self-study" used by school leaders and teams to answer questions and show evidence describing how they provide high quality Catholic education through the school's entire educational program. Schools draft a Roadmap for Excellence which includes developing action steps and a timeline for areas of recommended growth.

A team of school leaders from the archdiocese reviews each school's study and makes an on-site visit, ours is February 29-March 1. This includes visiting classrooms and talking with staff members to see how the nine Principles of Excellence (Academic Achievement and Integration, Virtue Formation, Spiritual Life, Apostolic Discernment, United with the Catholic Church, Effective Governance and Leadership, Partnership Engagement, Financial Sustainability, and Access) are incorporated throughout the school and where there are opportunities for growth.
